WCIA Session: Homelessness After *Grants Pass*: What Washington City Attorneys Need to Know

Description	The U.S. Supreme Court's 2024 decision in <i>Grants Pass v. Johnson</i> significantly changed the legal landscape surrounding municipal regulation of public camping and homelessness. But while <i>Grants Pass</i> resolved an important Eighth Amendment question, it did not resolve many of the constitutional, statutory, and procedural issues that continue to create liability risks for Washington cities. This two-hour program, will examine where the law stands now, what has developed since <i>Grants Pass</i>, and the issues courts are likely to confront next. Beginning with a brief review of <i>Martin v. Boise</i> and <i>Grants Pass</i>, the program will address what the Supreme Court changed—and just as importantly, what it did not. Participants will receive an update on significant federal, Ninth Circuit, and Washington developments affecting municipal homelessness ordinances, public-space regulation, and enforcement.

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Description A city employee uses ChatGPT to draft a procurement document. A requester uses AI to generate a sweeping records request. The records officer considers using AI to search, review, or redact the response. Each scenario presents distinct and evolving questions under the PRA. This session will examine how existing public records principles apply across that lifecycle, from prompts, outputs, chat histories, and uploaded materials that may become public records, to AI-assisted and automated requests, to agency use of AI in records processing. The focus will be practical: reducing unnecessary record creation, preserving and locating AI-related records, distinguishing AI-assisted requests from statutory requests, and using AI without compromising accuracy, confidentiality, or defensibility.

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Description The ADA Title II web rule was expected to go into effect in April 2026 for local governments with populations of more than 50,000 and April 2027 for less than 50,000. However, it has been pushed back a year, now going into effect in April 2027 and April 2028, respectively. Local jurisdictions now have more time to work towards compliance.

The City of Vancouver began its work on compliance in 2024 and continues to implement the rule despite the delayed compliance date. This session will cover the history of web accessibility under Title II, the forthcoming web rule, its exceptions, and the City's strategies to move towards compliance across the organization.
